Coinbase functions as a cryptocurrency exchange, not a traditional bank, and this distinction matters greatly **

Unlike banks, blockchain transactions cannot be reversed once confirmed on the network \bigcirc

Coinbase does not control the blockchain and cannot reverse completed transfers
